

# Conference Fieldtrips



#### ISTA BYLAWS

Idaho Science Teaching Association Bylaws Adopted August 4 2022

#### Preamble

These Bylaws are subject to, and governed by, the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act and the Articles of Incorporation of the Idaho Science Teaching Association. In the event of a direct conflict between the provisions of these Bylaws and the mandatory provisions of the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act will be controlling. In the event of a direct conflict between the provisions of these Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation of the Idaho Science Teaching Association, these Bylaws will be controlling.

Article I - Purpose

- 1.1 General. The Idaho Science Teaching Association (ISTA) is a Chapter and Associated Group (CAG) of the National Science Teaching Association (INSTA). The purposes for which the Idaho Science Teaching Association is organized are:
- 1.1.1 To create an active interest in science among educators, students, and community members
- 1.1.2 To encourage more effective science teaching at all levels of instruction in both formal and informal settings in the schools and colleges in the State of Idaho.
- 1.1.3 To provide professional development for best practices in science instruction.
- 1.1.4 To create a space for collaboration and idea sharing between science educators about pedagogy, practices, and instruction.
- 1.1.5 To create opportunities for integration of science across all disciplines of teaching.
- 1.1.6 The ISTA is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, scientific, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Specifically, the ISTA shall work to strengthen nonprofits through consulting, education, networking, and resources.


## ISTA Bylaws

If you are new to our organization or you have been a little overwhelmed with the day to day workflow of your current position, you may not be aware that the ISTA board took most of last year to rewrite and update our bylaws document. The <u>entire document</u> (approved at our fall conference last year -- August 2022) is available for review on our website. Feel free to take a moment and read through the document. This is a living document and amendments can be made using the procedures outlined in section 7 of our bylaws.

**7.1 Initiation of Amendments.** Proposed amendments may be initiated by the Executive Committee or by any one of the district representatives. Written text for the amendment should be submitted to the

President at least 7 days prior to the next Executive Committee meeting for review of the Executive Committee.

**7.2 Voting.** The Executive Committee may amend these Bylaws by majority vote at any regular or special meeting. Written notice setting forth the proposed amendment or summary of the changes to be effected thereby shall be given to each member within the time and the manner provided for the giving of notice of meetings.

- Communications Coordinator (OPEN)
- Region 2 (OPEN)
- Region 4 (OPEN)

Please consider becoming an active part of our team by nominating yourself for one of these positions! If you know someone who has some awesome leadership potential, recruit them to put their names in the hat for a seat on the ISTA board. The job descriptions for each position are listed in section 4 of the bylaws document (linked above) along with our elections procedures (shown below) which are listed in section 3 of that document.


**3.4 Elections.** Members of the Executive Committee shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Idaho Science Teaching Association members. Any member, in good standing, may attend the annual

meeting and be eligible to vote in the election of Executive Committee members.

- 3.4.1 Nominations can be made in writing before the meeting or may be accepted from the floor of the annual meeting.
- 3.4.2 New and renewing Executive Committee members shall be approved by a simple majority of the votes received at the time of voting. Positions with only a single candidate may be elected by acclamation.
- 3.4.3 If the election of Executive Committee members shall not be held at such a meeting, such an election shall be held as soon as possible. Voting that does not happen at the annual meeting shall be either by hard-copy or digital balloting as determined by the Executive Committee.
- **3.5 Term of Office.** All positions on the Executive Committee shall be elected for a term of two years. Elected officials shall take office at the annual meeting.
  - 4.1.2 The Executive Committee shall consist of the above-named officers and one representative elected by the membership from each of the following geographical districts in the state of Idaho:
    - · District 1. Boundary, Bonner, Benewah, Kootenai, and Shoshone Counties
    - · District 2. Latah, Clearwater, Idaho, Nez Perce, and Lewis Counties
    - · District 3. Adams, Washington, Payette, Gem, Canyon, and Owyhee Counties
    - · District 4. Blaine, Camas, Gooding, Lincoln, Cassia, Minidoka, Twin Falls, and Jerome Counties
    - District 5. Bear Lake, Franklin, Oneida, Power, Bannock, Caribou, and Bingham Counties
    - District 6. Clark, Fremont, Lemhi, Custer, Butte, Teton, Madison, Jefferson, and Bonneville
    - · District 7. Valley, Boise, Ada, and Elmore Counties
